## How Stress can Follow you Home

Combat stress can impact a Veteran's daily life in many ways and impede their interactions with colleagues, friends and family.

Stress may cause a Veteran to feel hostile or angry. It can also lead to sleeplessness and can even prevent a Veteran from connecting emotionally with others. In addition, stress can negatively impact a Veteran's professional life; stressed individuals often fatigue more easily, have difficulty concentrating and miss work more frequently.

If you feel that you may be experiencing symptoms related to combat stress or military sexual trauma, please contact your nearest VA health care facility.
